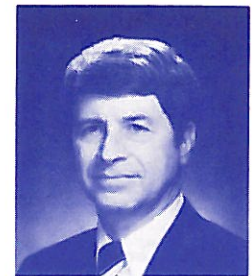

Our 1976 campaign has been completed and the funds raised have been allocated. It is now time to reflect on the past year, briefly, and think seriously about the future.




